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1. GENERAL INFORMATION

On Friday July 25, Saturday July 26 and Sunday July 27 2025, the Watersley Junior & Ladies Challenge U19 2.Ncup will take place on and around Watersley Sports & Talentpark, Sittard, The Netherlands.

Friday there will be an explosive time trial. The stages on Saturday and Sunday will take us through the technical and hilly landscape around Watersley Sports & Talentpark.

4. RACE REGULATIONS

Art.1 ORGANIZATION

The Watersley Junior & Ladies Challenge 2025 to be held on Friday, July 25, Saturday, July 26 and Sunday, July 27, by Stichting Watersley Topsports, hereinafter referred to as “the organization”.

The race will be contested under the auspices and in accordance with the regulations, decisions and annual detailed rules and instructions of the UCI. The race for the ladies is categorized as a UCI Nations Cup U19 . For the men it’s categorized as class 2.1. The organization holds the UCI racing license and government permits & waivers. These licenses, permits and waivers are available for inspection at the organization’s secretary.



Art. 2 TYPE OF EVENT

The Watersley Junior & Ladies Challenge is open to teams of junior men and women.

The race will be run under the UCI regulations and this technical guide.

Art. 4 PARTICIPATION

During the inscription, valid 2025 licenses must be shown to the organization and the UCI designated commissaires before the racenumbers and transponders will be handed out. The team leaders, soigneurs, mechanics should also be in possession of a valid license for the year 2025. The race is open to National Teams, Regional Teams, Club Teams and Mixed Teams. It has a minimum of 4 riders and maximum of 6 riders per team.

Art 5 CLASSIFICATIONS

The order of priority of the individual classifications is in the order in which they are mentioned in art. 5

General Classification (GC) / GOLD-YELLOW

The winner shall be the rider whose sum of times in the individual stages, including the time bonuses and the penalties, will be the lowest.
Bonifications awarded in the road stages, but not for the time trial:
- Stage 2 & 3 classification 10" - 6" - 4".

In the event of a tie in the individual general classification a decision is made based on following criteria in order:

- 1. the fractions of a second registered during individual time trial
- 2. the lowest sum of placings obtained in each stage
- 3. the place obtained in the last stage ridden

Sprint Classification / GREEN JERSEY

For the sprint classification, points can be earned at the finishline, during an intermediate sprint and at the finish of the stage. At the intermediate sprints and at the sprints at the finish of the stage, the first 4 riders receive: 5, 3, 2 and 1 point.
At the intermediate sprints in stage 2 & 3 the first 3 riders receive bonification seconds for the GC; 6" - 4" - 2".

Mountain Classification / POLKA DOT JERSEY

At the mountain classification, the first 4 riders receive: 5, 3, 2 and 1 point.
In case there is a tie in the mountain and sprint standings, rule 2.6.017 is followed to determine the results.

All Kilometer marks are excluding the neutralization of the stage.

Youth Classification (YC) / WHITE JERSEY

The YC is based on the YC after each stage. The YC is open to riders who were born in the year 2008.

Team Competition

The team classification for the day shall be calculated based on the sum of the three best individual times from each team.

In the event of a tie, the following criteria shall be applied in order until the teams are separated;

1. Number of first places in the daily team classifications
2. Number of second places in the daily team classifications etc.
3. The placing of their best rider in the general individual classification

A team with fewer than three riders shall be eliminated from the general team classification, since you need at least 3 riders for this classification.

Art. 6 AWARDS CEREMONY

All ceremonies will take place 15 minutes after the finish of the stage. The ceremonies of stage 1 & 2 will be attended by the first 3 riders of the stage and the leading riders of each classifications.

The ceremony after stage 3 will be attended by the first 3 riders of the stage; the first 3 riders of the general classification, the winners of the secondary classifications, including best team & the nation leading the UCI Junior women Nations Cup.

The financial prizes will be wire transferred to all teams after the races. After the Watersley Junior & Ladies Challenge, teams will receive an e-mail in which they are requested to leave their bank information.

Art. 7 START ORDER TIME TRIAL

Starting order Ladies will be based on the following criteria in order;

The team that comes out first according to these criteria will start as the last team.

1. National selections according to the latest Junior women Nations Cup standing
2. National selections who are not included in the latest Junior women Nations Cup standing according to a draw
3. All other teams according to a draw

Starting order Junior men will be determined by drawing 1 week before the event and will be shared by e-mail to all sports-directors before the event

Riders start every 60 seconds and can be followed by the teamcar. Before the start the rider has to pass the bike check of the jury and comply with UCI regulations.

Bike-check will be conducted based on the length category registered with the UCI.

The team leaders determine the starting order of their riders during the licence check.

Art. 8 RACE NUMBERS

The distribution of racenumbers and transponders will take place on Thursday, July 24th, at the permanence Watersley Sports & Talentpark, Watersley 31, Sittard. The race numbers will be provided to the team leaders upon providing valid licenses from the participants. The frame number should be clearly visible on the bike. The transponder must be mounted on the front fork as near as possible to the axle. All riders who participate in the race will use the KNWU transponders. The transponders must be attached to the bike for all 3 stages.

Art. 9 TIME LIMITS & 3 KM rule

In the ITT, stage 1, the time limit is 50%

In stage 2 & 3, riders who are too far behind the leaders will be taken out of the race.

This decision will be made in consultation with the local police. For each stage, the time limit can be changed because of unpredictable circumstances.

For the last 3 km of stage 2 & 3 Article 2.6.027 from the UCI regulations will be applied.

Art. 10 TEAM VEHICLES

Team vehicles are allowed to follow in all stages. The order of the team vehicles for the 2nd and 3rd stage shall be determined according to the position of the first rider of each team in the general individual time classification. Therefore your position of stage 3 will likely be different to stage 2.

The numbers will be distributed at the permanence for stage 2 & 3.

Art. 11 JURY & SPORTS DIRECTORS MEETING

The jury & sports directors meeting takes place at the Plaza of Watersley Sports & Talentpark in Sittard. The time and place is stated in the day schedule. Attendance is mandatory.

Art. 12 TRAFFIC RULES

All participants and officials in the caravan must adhere to the normal rules and traffic regulations. They should drive on the right-hand side of the road as much as possible and follow the instructions or orders from the police, race marshals and commissaires. All participating vehicles in the caravan must have valid liability insurance.

Art. 13 RADIO-TOUR

K.N.W.U. Radio tour: frequency 155.9375 MHz (KNWU 1)

During stages 2 & 3 the teams are obligated to have the proper equipment in the car so the commissaires can communicate with you during the race.
It is the responsibility of the teams to make sure this is correct.

Art. 14 LIABILITY

The organization accepts no responsibility for accidents or damage to riders, followers or third parties before, during or after the race.

Art. 15 ANTI-DOPING CONTROL

The UCI's anti-doping control regulations will be applicable. The anti-doping control takes place at the finish of each stage. Anti-doping rooms will be marked.

Art. 16 DECISIONS

Non-observance of these rules can disqualify the participant from the race and/or result in sanctions against the rider and/or the team leader. In cases not covered by these regulations, a ruling will be made by:

- For race technical issues, the commissaires’ panel
- For organizational issues, the organization

Art. 17 PENALTIES

Penalties are applied in accordance with the standards of the UCI.

Art. 18 RESULTS

Results will be published in the following ways: shared on our social channels, published on our website and the publication links will be shared by mail to all sports directors.

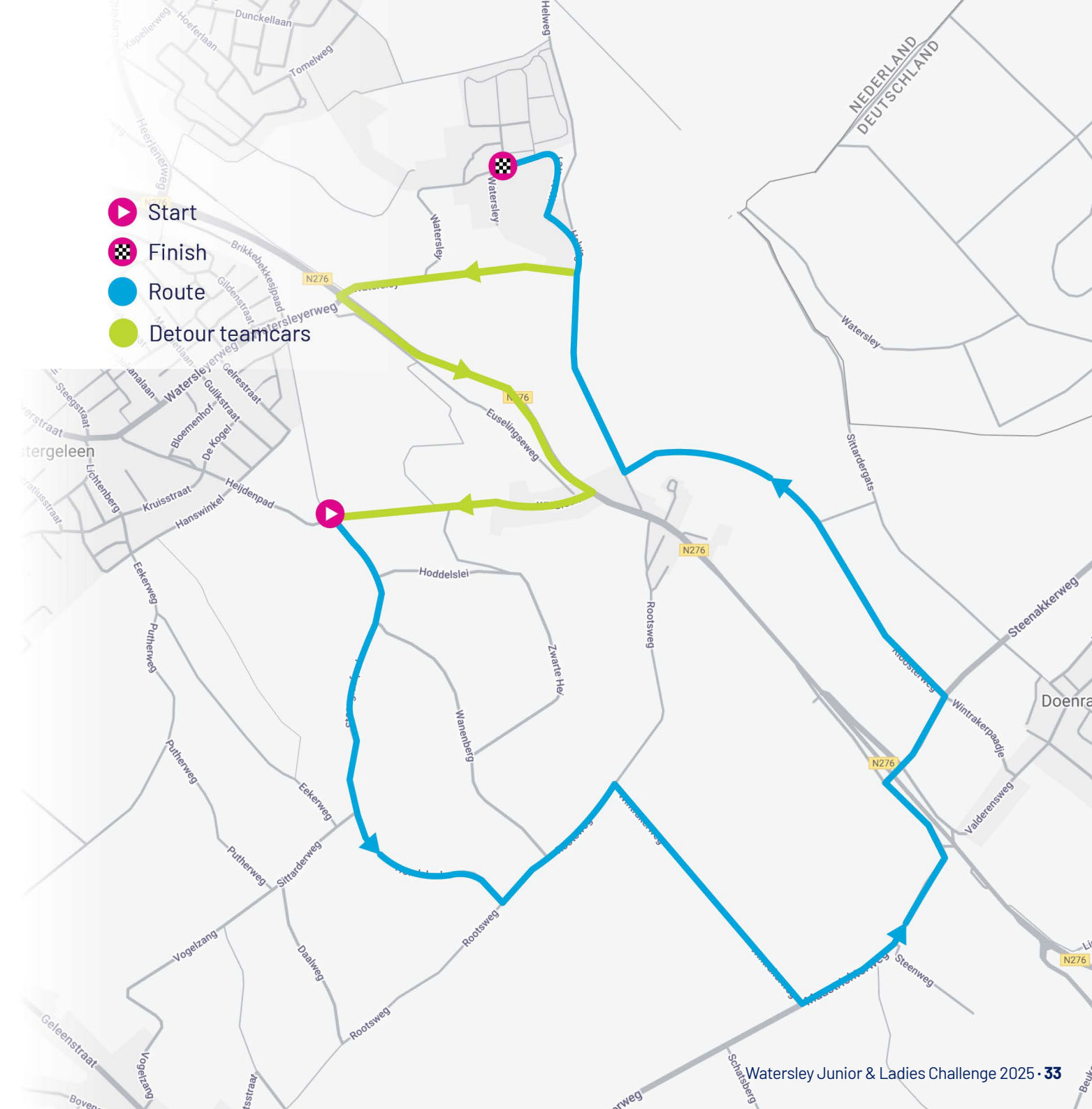

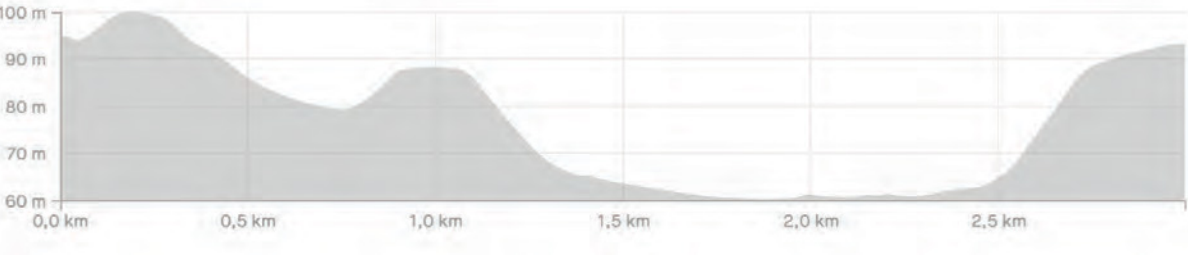

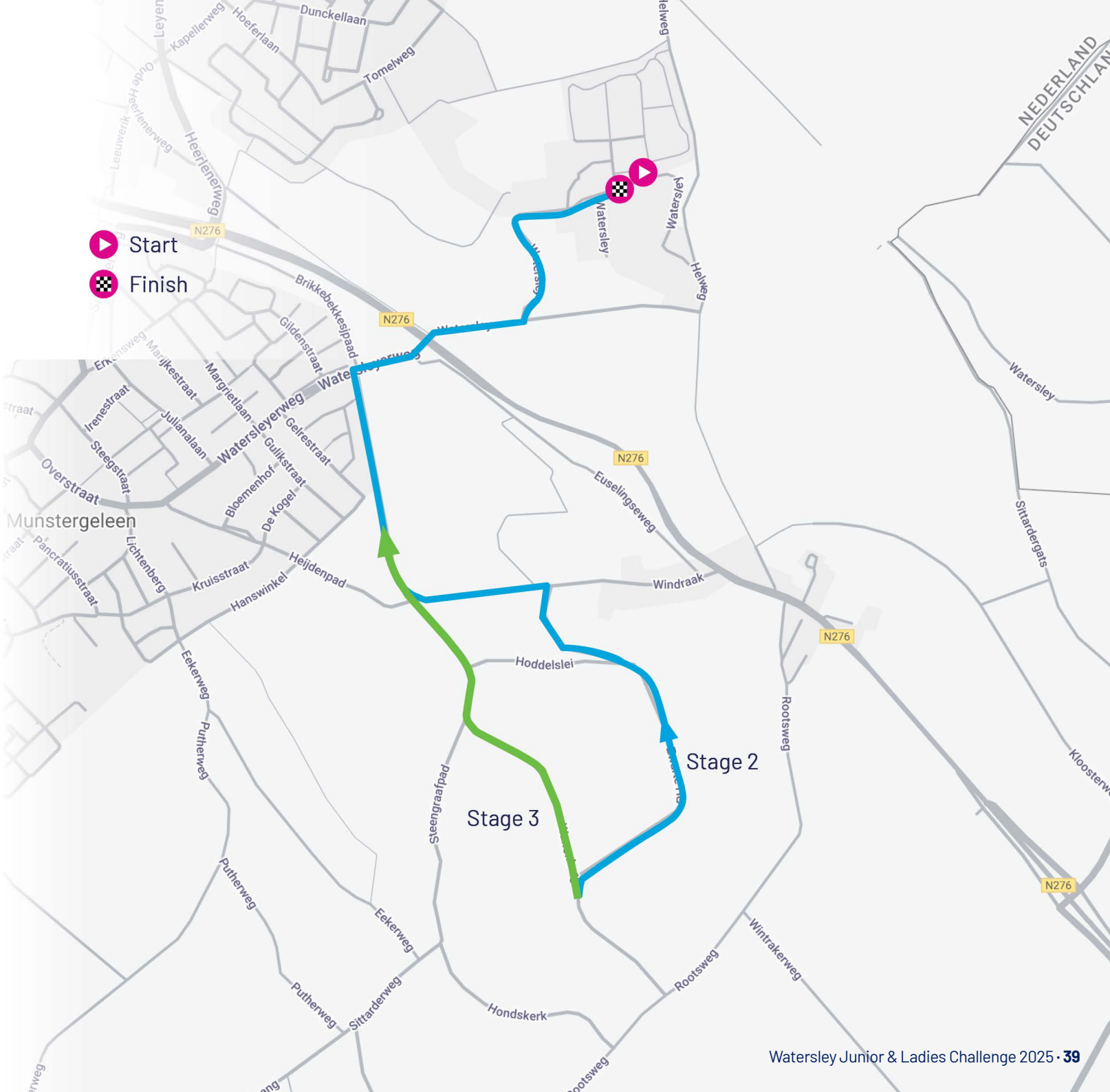
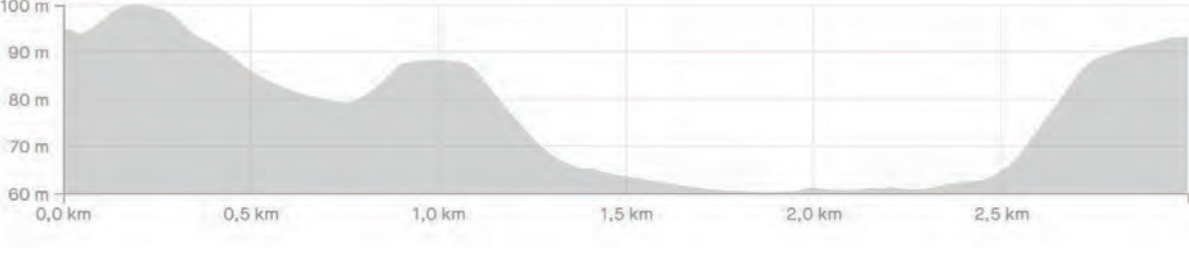
Stage 2
